

The agreement was signed in the Moscow National House.

The whole conference was very interesting, and its topic was very important and informative, I am glad that we have the same opinion on the importance of Slavic reciprocity.



we are grateful and happy that, thanks to the possibility of project cooperation between our schools, we have the opportunity to get to know and learn more about the culture, history and beauty of Russia.

After a very pleasant meeting we went to Peterhof to see the gardens, the bay and the interior of the mansion.


After a long day full of traveling and admiring the sights, we spent a beautiful evening walking from the Aurora to the center of St. Petersburg.
